“Living a Legacy” Fellowship Breakfast with Crawford Loritts Saturday, June 28 • 7 a.m.



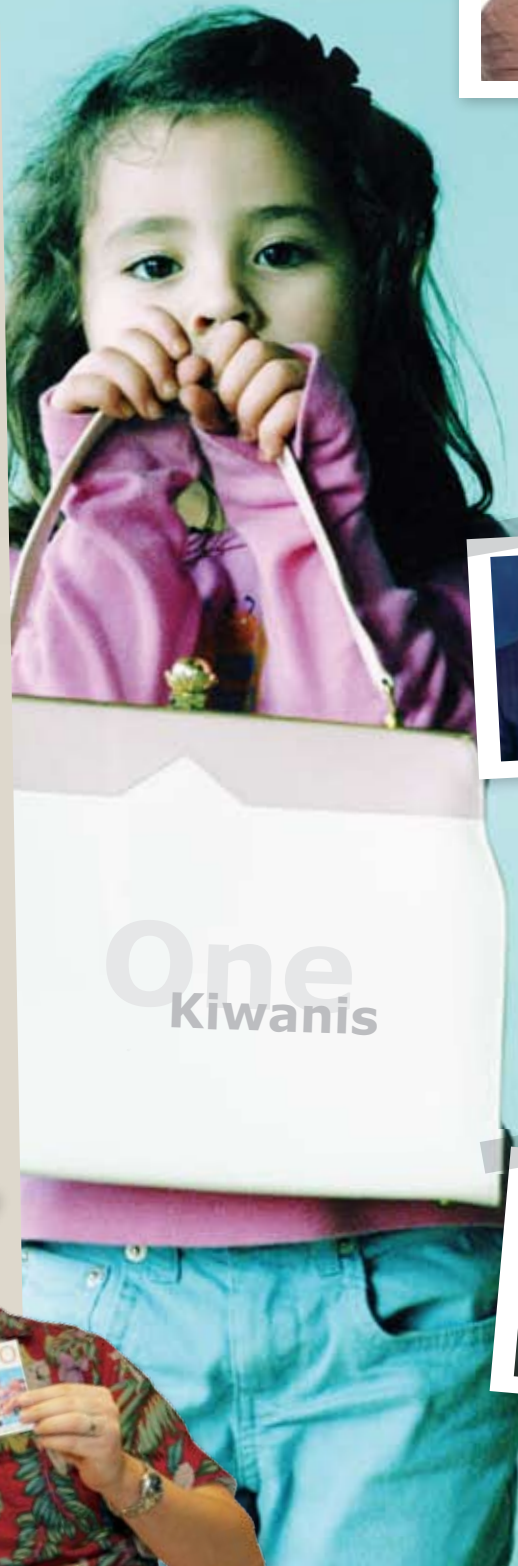

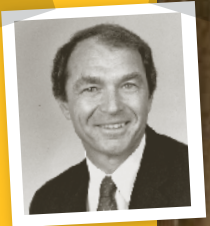
